



## Ann Dubas

November 13, 1916 - December 10, 2006

Ann Dubas passed away Sunday evening, December 10, 2006 at the age of 90. Ann Humenchuk Dubas was born in Philadelphia in 1916 and moved to Deptford, NJ with husband Peter and their children Anne, Gloria and Peter, Jr. in 1950. Early on, Ann worked for Philco; Mom stayed home to raise her children and be a homemaker. Her passions lay in crafting and baking. Her talented hands created beautiful pieces through various forms of stitchery as well as the elegant Ukranian decorated eggs she shaved during Easter. Her creativeness in the kitchen won Ann numerous awards including the prestigious Pillsbury Bake Off Championships. Within the community, Ann was a charter member of the Deptford Democrat Club. She was also one of the key organizers of what would become the Senior Citizens Group in Deptford, and remained actively involved with these organizations. Ann supported many charitable events in her community and remained strongly connected to her church, Most Holy Redeemer.

Ann is survived by her three children Anne Booth of Westville, Gloria Dubas of Deptford and Peter Dubas, Jr. of Melbourne, Beach, Fl. Five Grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren and other members of her family.
