November 1, 1946 - June 14, 2023

On the morning of June 14, 2023, a day that was quickly accompanied by a warm spring rain, we said goodbye to a woman who can only be described as “one in a million.” Anne F. Schramm (nee Bresch), known to many as “Nancy” or “Nance,” lost her battle with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. Passing peacefully in the company of loved ones, we remember Nancy in health. We remember her for the vivacious spirit and selfless demeanor that helped mold a world in which her loss feels catastrophic to those who were lucky enough to know her.

Born November 1, 1946, Nancy grew up as one of five children. Her close-knit family frequented Philadelphia and the Jersey Shore—namely Wildwood. Summer days growing up were spent at the beach from the early morning until sunset. The sun, sand, and waves were built into her character as much as her outgoing personality and affable sense of humor.

Nancy was a die-hard Philadelphia Eagles fan. A season ticket holder dating back to “The Vet,” Nancy’s love for the game of football—and the Birds—quickly overflowed to her son and grandchildren. Row 32 in Section 109 at the Lincoln Financial Field quickly became a second home to her family. That family wasn’t just those who shared her blood or last name. Nancy had family in every corner of her life. She had a group of sister “witches” who were her partners in crime, coworkers from her 50-plus years at Stevens International

who were her second family (read the company's tribute to Nancy, https://drive.google.com/file/d/1jenJvvZADf-gHvaJ5NX7zk5L-_RPHPnN/view), and friends that she cherished immensely.

We celebrate Nancy for everything that she was: a sister, mother, wife, aunt, niece, grandmother, friend, partner in crime, confidant, and safe space. We remember her as a strong woman with a free spirit and a love that knew no bounds. We will cherish every memory from the beginning to the end. We know she is no longer suffering and is catching up with old friends, surrounded by passed family, and cheering on the Eagles from above.
