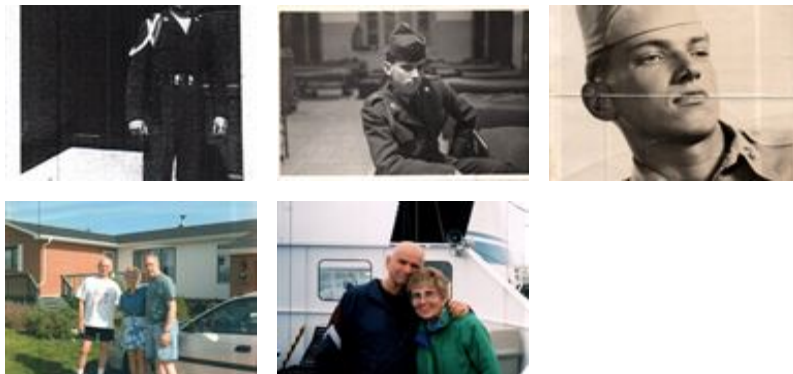

I worked there for over 46 years till the building was sold as an apartment building. He was like my big brother. We often hung out together going out to lunch or to the Casinos in A.C. I remember the day he crushed between 2 cars by a very drunk MARY MASON. I thought he would never walk again, but after a very painful recovery he became a runner and ran The Broad St. Run (10 miles) I remember when his son, ARLEIGH was born. He was so proud of him. Even after we were both retired, we always kept in touch with each other. I took Buddy to The LIVE Casino on his 90th Birthday and gave him \$90 dollars to gamble and took him out to lunch to his favorite restaurant near him. I truly loved Buddy as if he was my older brother and I will miss him very much. FYI- I remember when that picture of Buddy was taken outside The Latham Hotel on a Wednesday night in the rain (he's holding an umbrella opening a cab door).
