View Barbara's Video Tribute [Barbara Kelly Rhodes](#), 74, of Deptford, NJ died on Wednesday, April 23, 2008, at her home with the love of family surrounding her. Born in Rome, New York in 1934, to Pauline and Rushton Dennis Kelly, she graduated from Holland Patent High School before marrying Air Force officer Robert Nies Rhodes and traveling as a military spouse. She was co-founder and vice president for the Coalition of Families, worked closely with the ARC of Burlington County in New Jersey. Surviving are her husband of 52 years, Robert Rhodes; three siblings, Patricia (Kelly) Baer of Ada, MI, Laura (Kelly) Scarpelli of Carlsbad, Ca, and Dennis Kelly of Washington, NH; three daughters, Diana (Rhodes) Cook of Phoenix, NY, Paula Rhodes of Atlanta, GA, Danielle Rhodes of Lumberton, NJ, and one son, Michael Nies Rhodes of Westville, NJ, their spouses, Stephen R.Cook and Dawn (Rosario) Rhodes; grandchildren Amber, Brittany, Jocelyn and Chad Cook, and Rushton and Gavin Rhodes, all of whom she loved dearly..
