Born in Milwaukee, WI, George graduated with a degree in Food Chemistry from Univ. of Wisconsin.

George served in counter-intelligence in the US Army in Berlin Germany during the Korean war. Despite the tensions of the Cold War, George and his army buddies still found time for adventure, and on one occasion traveled to Monaco and crashed the wedding reception of Princess Grace and Prince Rainier.

In civilian life George was a long time resident of Gloucester County, NJ and worked for over 30 years at DuPont, mostly at Repauno in Gibbstown, a time highlighted by editing the book published for the Centennial Celebration of the Repauno Plant. He retired as Employee Relations Supervisor. He continued working by obtaining his Realtor license and representing Maffucci and Coldwell Banker for several years.

In his retirement George pursued his interest in computing, current affairs and genealogy. He and Carol also traveled across the midwest and southern United States, particularly enjoying vacationing in Jekyll Island, GA.

George was a good man, proud veteran, and beloved husband, father and grandfather who is survived by wife Carol (Dawson), daughter Dorothy Cooper, son-in-law John Cooper, and grandson David Hudson.
