“ Jack is one of my oldest and dearest friends. We share hundreds of hours and experiences together in Scouts, Little League and on Maple Avenue. He was a great friend for over 70 years.

He wanted to replace By Saam as the Phillies radio announcer growing up.

I would like to recount a story. In 1974 after graduating from college, I was driving from Haddon Heights to my first duty assignment in El Paso, TX. I invited Jack to join me on my journey. We had stopped on the PA TPKE to eat lunch. My car had Flyers decals on the rear window and street hockey sticks in the back seat. A 10 year old kid walked up to us while we were eating our sandwiches at a rest stop picnic table. He asked if we played for the Flyers. I said yes and introduced myself as obscure player Ross Lonsberry. Jack pipes in with his best Bela Lugosi voice, "My name is Moose Dupont." We signed autographs and made the kid's day... We saw a game in Wrigley Field, the Phils-Cards in a DH at Busch, road on a riverboat, spend an evening on Bourbon St in New Orleans, saw the Astros in the Astrodome, saw the A's-Rangers in Arlington (the night that Nixon resigned), stopped in Pecos, TX before arriving in the Sun City.

Jack had never been more than a 2 hour drive out of Haddon Heights prior to this trip. He saw a whole lot of Americana in this 8 day drive. One I'm sure he never forgot.
