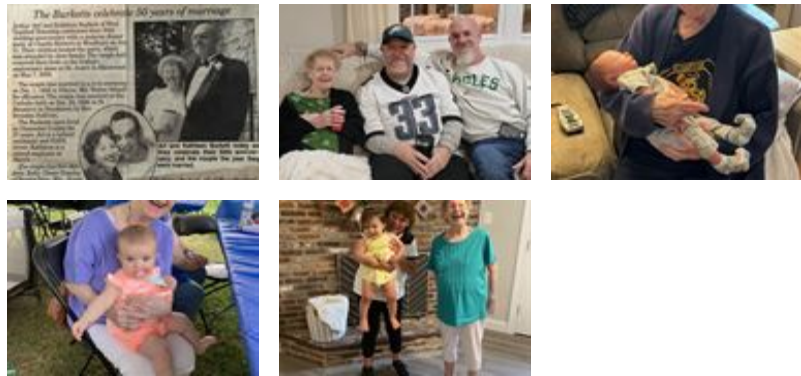

“ We were born of an age when kids were feral, roaming the neighborhood from house to house. Don't get me wrong, we were far from unloved or cared for. Quite the contrary, the adults in our lives treated each of us as their own. We were fed, clothed, bandaged, and tucked in by the head of whosever roof you happened to be under. And run a fowl of any of them and you were likely to get an earful from your buddy's mom as she marched you home to get a whooping from your own.

*These were people born at the tail end of the Great Depression, in grade school during World War 2, became teenagers in the Happy Days, started their families at a time of assassination, and took a leap to the burbs just as man first stepped on the moon. They saw Richie Ashburn go from Whiz Kid to the broadcast booth, watched Concrete Charlie dominate both sides of Franklin Field, witnessed the birth of the 76ers and Bobby and Bernie hoist two Stanley Cups. They understood that it took a village and to our great fortune, they built it. How lucky were we to be raised by giants, and despite her stature, none stood taller than Kathleen Burkett.*

*Mrs. Burkett was the living embodiment of grace under pressure. Raising 5 kids, each having their own contingent of disciples roaming the three floors of that great green house on DuBois Ave. She was the eye of the storm calmly moving steadily forward despite the chaos and destruction all around. Not a one of us saw a summer lunchtime go by without a PB&J and a glass of Tang. Mrs. Burkett made sure of that. I remember her showing up to every sporting event, holiday parade, and Oakview School pageant, always with younger, Koolaide mustached, kids in tow, applauding enthusiastically from the front row. Personally, I recall her sweet soothing voice that never seemed to be raised in anger or frustration, plus a knowing and reassuring smile that she shared with us all no matter whose kid we really were. We ALL felt like we belonged to Mrs. Burkett, and she would care for and defend us as if we did. Thanks, Mrs. B.*

*I imagine it was a mighty party when she went on to join the giants. In typical Kathleen Burkett fashion, she was the last to leave, just in case we needed some help cleaning up.*

*Kelly, Sean, Kevin, Coleen, Kara and ALL the Burkett clan, we pray that the grace of your mom will calm you all through this and future storms. The grief we feel is the price we pay for having been loved well, and she loved us ALL very, very well.*
