When I was in elementary school, my family moved from Philadelphia to New Jersey to be closer to my grandma (in the same neighborhood, just around the corner to be exact). Oftentimes, being the scatterbrained person that I am, I would forget my home key. Tired and hungry after getting off the school bus, I would walk over to my grandma's house unannounced. Instead of asking what I was doing there, she would just embrace me with open arms, what seemed like a five-course meal (with homemade barley tea), and interesting stories about her past. She was always so happy to see me, and I was happy to see her. Suddenly, all the stresses of my day would melt away as we watched the latest Korean drama on the television. It was the best and I could always rely on her.

Of course, there were times that weren't all smiles. A lot of my memories include hard work with my grandma in her large garden. She would invite me and my sisters over at the crack of dawn to help water the plants, pull weeds, and pick an array of vegetables (cucumbers, peppers, leeks, squash... you name it- she had it in her garden). At the end of it, she would send us home with an enormous number of veggies, enough to fill up the whole fridge, and make a dish for us to eat at dinner. She never wished for us to be hungry and made sure we left with a full belly. I would do anything to

have another bowl of her spicy, savory 육개장, filled to the brim with meat and fresh green onions.

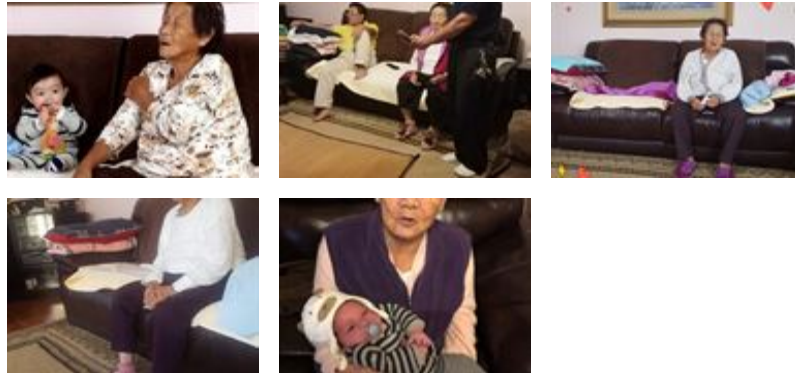
I miss you so much, grandma. I hope to be as remarkable as you were and live with vigor and fearlessness. Love you.
