William J. Whittaker, 85, of Deptford, N.J. passed away on April 4, 2008. Predeceased by wife Catherine M Whittaker (nee Murphy). Father of William J. Whittaker, Jr. (Claire) of Logan Twp, James (Deceased) (Virginia), Thomas (Denise) of Deptford and Eileen Flannagan of Bradenton, FL. Eight grandchildren.

Born May 11, 1922 to John and Cora Mae Whittaker in Camden N.J. Family moved to Philadelphia. With sisters Sara, Charlotte and brother Joseph, endured the Depression years. After grade school and a year of high school, worked at Baldwin Locomotive in Essington, Pa as a acetylene metal plate cutter. In 1943 joined the USAAF and was a communications technician with the 14TH Air Force in the CBI Theater of Operations with the "Flying Tigers." After a honorable discharge, came back to the Philadelphia area and worked in the construction industry. Married Catherine Murphy in 1950, had 3 sons and moved to New Jersey in 1955. Continued construction work then became a delivery truck driver for various bread companies. Daughter born in 1964. Lived in Westville Oaks section of South Jersey until Moving to Maple Shade and eventually Lindenwold N.J. before retiring. Later, drove a school bus and moved to Florida. Came back to N.J. in 2005. Wife Catherine died on July 8, 2006. Lived at Nancy Elkins Apts. until death on April 4, 2008. Survived by 2 sons and their spouses, 1 daughter and 8 grandchildren. Lifelong fan of Notre Dame football, and Philadelphia sports teams.
